Two Fates Revelation 14:6-13

- 1. "Choose one from two", but you chose the wrong one! Have you ever had such a tragic experience? How were you feeling at that time?
- 2. Amidst the singing of a choir of 144,000 people, an angel flew in the middle of the sky, preaching the eternal gospel to all the nations and peoples living on the earth. What is the significance of adding the word "eternal" in front of the gospel? What determines our eternal destination?
- 3. What in your life worthy to be listed as "eternal"? When evaluating things in life as temporary or eternal, what new insights can you gain and what decisions have you made?
- 4. The first angel announced the gospel, but the second angel announced judgment. What does "Babylon the Great" here symbolize? What brings God's wrath?
- 5. In the announcement of the third angel, humanity was divided into which two camps? How can you identify them?
- 6. In verses 10-11, how does the Bible use wine of "full strength" to describe the wrath of God?
- 7. In your belief, is it necessary for God of love and God of wrath to coexist? What are the dangers of favoring (forgetting) one side?
- 8. From verse 12, we clearly see that the purpose of recording this vision is to exhort Christians to persevere. How does the Bible describe these Christians?
- 9. No longer an announcement from an angel, but a voice directly from heaven saying: "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on." Can you list some reasons why death can be viewed as a blessing?
- 10. Before you rest from your labor, what unfinished work do you have that has eternal value and can follow you to heaven?
