

The Marriage of the Lamb
Revelation 19:1-10

1. How many times does "Hallelujah!" appear in this passage? What do they express?
2. 19:2-3 mentions how God judges the "great prostitute"? How does this demonstrate God's justice and faithfulness?
3. How have you experienced God "vindicating" you or leading you through an unjust situation? Please share.
4. In 19:4, the twenty-four elders and the four living creatures bowed down in worship and shouted "Amen! Hallelujah!" What inspiration does this give to our church worship today?
5. "Hallelujah" appears many times in this passage. When you face injustice or suffering, how can you learn to praise and rest in God's sovereignty?
6. How can 19:5-7 describe the joyful scene of the Marriage of the Lamb? How does the Marriage of the Lamb illustrate the relationship between the church and Christ?
7. 19:8-9 mentions that the bride is wearing "fine linen, bright and clean." What is this fine linen? How do you suggest that we can live out such righteousness in our daily lives?
8. In 19:9-10, the angel emphasized that "these are the true words of God," and John was reminded to "Worship God!" What reminder does this give us when we receive God's revelation or when we teach?
9. The corruption of the "great prostitute" and the holiness of the "bride" in the scripture form a sharp contrast. How can this encourage us in our resisting secular culture?
10. This passage mentions "Blessed are those who are invited to the wedding supper of the Lamb!" What new insights do you have about the hope of the end times? How will you prepare to attend the marriage supper of the Lamb?
